### **NEWS FROM THE PRESIDENT**

I have been asked to explain how we fund the ribbons for our quilt show. The specialty ribbons are made by Terry Passon and other guild members. I have seen some of them and they are lovely works of art. But when we talk about sponsors for the ribbons, we are talking about having sponsors who provide the cash award that goes with each ribbon. The judge determines who gets each ribbon, without knowing who made the quilt. Here are the categories we have this year, and each one has a 1st, 2nd and 3rd place ribbon. A 1st place ribbon has an award of \$150, 2nd place \$115, and 3rd place \$85; whole category is a total of \$350:

- Bed Quilts, Pieced and Quilted
- Bed Quilts, Appliquéd and/or Mixed Techniques and Quilted
- Small Quilts, Pieced, Appliquéd and/or Mixed Techniques and Quilted
- Wall Quilts, Pieced and Quilted
- Wall Quilts, Appliquéd and/or Mixed Techniques and Quilted
- Two Person Team, Large
- Two Person Team, Small
- Art Quilts
- Pictorial
- Group
- Other Techniques — Kit quilts, yo-yo, cathedral window, crazy quilts, wholecloth, etc.
